1. Choose another person/s to go with you on the colour scavenger hunt.
2. Print out a colour wheel and paste onto cardboard. Cut out the circular wheel.

4. Collect small bits and pieces and match their colours to colours on the wheel.
5. Use pegs to attach and match some of the things you collect to colours on the wheel.
