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Salt painting

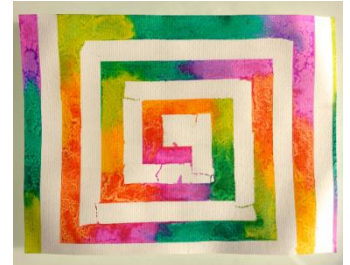
What you need:

Paint – thin it or use water colours

Salt

Art paper

Blue painter tape (enclosed.) You could also use masking tape



Start by partitioning the paper with the tape to make a design.

Paint the first section and while it is still wet sprinkle a little salt on the paint.

Paint the next section and again spring salt on. Repeat for all the sections.



When the paint is dry, peel off the tape.
