

# Resource Disclaimer

This resource was developed to support learning for remote mode students normally enrolled in distance education.

These documents have been harvested from distance education resources on March 12, 2020 to support all teachers in providing a continuity of learning for their students in the event of student absence during this difficult time.

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

**TASK:** Create a picture based on snowflakes using symmetry and colour.

**EQUIPMENT:**

Paper	<input type="checkbox"/>	Paint - blue, red	<input type="checkbox"/>
Scrap paper	<input type="checkbox"/>	Glitter - any colours	<input type="checkbox"/>

**INSTRUCTIONS:**

- Discuss the following facts about snowflakes:
  - they are made up of ice crystals
  - they appear in countless forms
  - they form a hexagonal or 6-sided structure
  - they are very intricate
- Cover paper with an even layer of blue paint.
- While blue paint is still wet, cover this with a layer of red paint, gently dabbing or stippling it to create purple, but try not to over blend the colours together.
- While paint is wet, scratch out snowflakes with end of paintbrush, using the following pattern:
 





- Allow paint to dry.
- Using pencil, draw snowflakes of different sizes on painted paper. Space the arms evenly and overlap them over snowflakes scratched into paint. Just draw the six arms (not the v shapes).
- Practice putting PVA glue onto scrap paper using the nozzle to get used to the technique. Remember it is best to use small, bottles of PVA glue that have nozzles.
- After practicing, begin one of the glue snowflakes by squeezing a line of glue along one of the snowflakes that has been pencilled in.
- To add the v-shapes, use the end of the paintbrush to drag glue on each arm outwards, away from the centre of the snowflake.
- Cover snowflake with sprinkled glitter and shake off excess glitter. (You can shake glitter onto a piece of newspaper and pour it into a jar or zip-lock bag for use in another activity).

**Note:** Make one glue snowflake at a time to avoid smudging the snowflakes together.
