Aboriginal Dreaming Stories

It is important when considering Aboriginal Education, that we pay respect to, and acknowledge the country on which we learn. This means, when you are on country, you teach country. Eg. NSS is on Awabakal country- we teach Awabakal perspectives, language, culture, and knowledge. In Tamworth, they are Kamilaroi country, we would teach Kamilaroi lore.
