Writing your own personal acknowledgement:

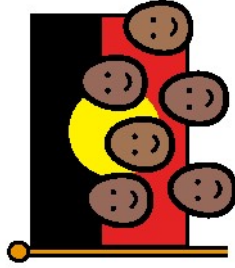
For this activity, students write their own personal acknowledgement to country. Use the communication board to support your choices.
