
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THE PATHWAYS - LIFE AFTER SCHOOL

There are a number of pathways that students with disability can consider when planning their life after school. For people with disability in the community seeking to move forward, the pathways are similar apart from day programs for Year 12 school leavers in areas where the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is yet to rollout. For those eligible for the NDIS, following the full roll out in mid-2016 to the rest of our region, there may be additional assistance when transitioning. (More on NDIS page 12).

TRANSITION PROGRAMS

NATIONAL DISABILITY COORDINATION OFFICER PROGRAM (NDCO)

The Australian Government's National Disability Coordination Officer (NDCO) Program works strategically to assist people with disability access and participate in tertiary education and subsequent employment, through a national network of regionally based NDCOs.

NDCOs work with stakeholders at the local level to reduce systemic barriers, facilitate smooth transitions, build links, and coordinate services between the education, training and employment sectors. The NDCO Program adopts the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) definition of disability.

The objectives of the NDCO Program... along with preparing this book for you!

- improve linkages between schools, tertiary education providers, employment service providers and providers of disability programs and assistance at all government levels;
- improve transitions for people with disability between school/community and tertiary education, and then to subsequent employment; and
- improve participation by people with disability in tertiary education and subsequent employment

Your NDCO can link you with local services in the tertiary education and employment sectors, let you know about upcoming career events and expos, provide information and referrals, provide professional development about rights and support in tertiary education and work, and much more. SUPPORT FOR YOUR DISABILITY

NATIONAL DISABILITY INSURANCE SCHEME (NDIS)

The National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) is the new way of providing individualised support for eligible people with permanent and significant disability, their families and carers. The NDIS trial has commenced in the Hunter area for people aged up to 65 years, and will rollout progressively to the rest of the Hunter-New England and Central Coast regions from July 2016.

NATIONAL DISABILITY INSURANCE AGENCY (NDIA) (ADMINISTER NDIS)

Many participants will move to the NDIS with the support of their current disability service when it's their turn to "transfer in", but if you need help or you're new to support, staff at NDIA reception can assist with enquiries and forms (you can also examine your eligibility on the NDIS Checklist http://ndis.nsw.gov.au/ready-for-ndis/checklist).

The NDIA holds regular community and provider forums which are listed on the *NSW Events Page* http://ndis.nsw.gov.au/events and on the national website www.ndis.gov.au/news/events/nsw. They may also offer some pre-planning workshops – ask your Planner or Local Area Coordinator (who you will be linked with) for more details when you receive news about your Eligibility.

Supports may include work experience generally in open employment, job site training, travel training, and activities that contribute to achieving an employment outcome and linkages to ongoing employment support. THE PATHWAYS - WHAT'S OUT THERE?

TRAINING

UNIQUE STUDENT IDENTIFIER - ALL TRAINING STUDENTS NEED THIS!

Every year, an estimated three million Australians build their skills by undertaking nationally recognised training. All students doing nationally recognised training need to have a Unique Student Identifier (USI). This includes students doing Vocational Education Training (VET) in schools.

A USI is a reference number made up of numbers and letters. <u>Creating a USI</u> is free. It creates a secure online record of your nationally recognised training that you can access anytime and anywhere, and it's yours for life.

The USI is linked to the National Vocational Education and Training (VET) Data Collection, and this means an individual's nationally recognised training and qualifications gained anywhere in Australia, from different training organisations, will be kept all together.

The USI will:

- link a student's VET achievements, regardless of where in Australia they did the course
- let students easily access secure digital transcripts of their achievements (transcripts will be available from April 2016)
- give students more control over their VET information

TRAINING SERVICES NSW (PREVIOUSLY STATE TRAINING SERVICES) - VOCATIONAL EDUCATION & TRAINING

Vocational Education and Training (VET) is that part of tertiary education and training which provides accredited training in job related and technical skills. It covers a large number of careers and industries like trades and office work, retail, hospitality and technology. Training Services NSW funds and oversees the new Smart and Skilled model.

Qualifications range from certificate II to certificate IV, and diploma and advanced diploma. Individuals can be trained in part qualifications or 'skills sets'.

TAFE

Under <u>Smart and Skilled</u> the NSW Government is targeting funding towards skills that are needed for jobs and economic growth <u>https://smartandskilled.nsw.gov.au</u>

Each year the *Skills List* – online page www.training.nsw.gov.au/smartandskilled/nsw-skills-list.html - sets out priority areas for training. The qualifications on this list will receive government subsidies to make sure training priorities match the needs of the economy. This list includes qualifications that will attract a government subsidy that year plus their prices and fees.



The Skills List is reviewed annually and covers:

- Certificate II to Advanced Diploma qualifications
- Select Foundation Skills courses
- All apprenticeships and selected traineeships
- Part-qualifications for key groups and sectors

TAFE Disability Teacher Consultants

Teacher/Consultants provide a range of services to assist students. These include pre-course counselling and assistance with the enrolment process for those training at TAFE, as well as determining the most appropriate classroom support and assessment modifications. A range of strategies can be employed and may involve tutorial support, the use of assistive technology, a sign language interpreter, note-taker, or disability assistant.

Before enrolling in a course be sure to contact a Teacher Consultant who will be able to guide you through the process, discuss what exemptions you are entitled to, and put appropriate supports in place. See page 7 for contact details.

PREPARATION AND DISABILITY CONTACTS

Prepare early, base your decisions on good information, and plan ahead so that you can organise appropriate disability supports to assist you to be successful in your study. Look at the resources and websites on page 8-9 to assist in this planning.

Universities have Advisers to assist intending and current university students with disability, and require you to make an appointment before you commence so that any necessary adjustments and support can be discussed. Medical documentation will be required to support the reasonable adjustments requested for your disability.

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEME (EAS)

The Educational Access Scheme (EAS) helps students who have experienced long-term educational disadvantage gain admission to tertiary study. To be eligible for EAS consideration your educational performance must have been seriously affected, normally for a period of at least six months during Year 11 and/or 12 or equivalent, due to circumstances beyond your control including disability.

FUNDING UNDER SMART AND SKILLED

Government funding is available for the formal training component of apprenticeships and most traineeships. Under Smart and Skilled, all apprenticeship and most traineeship qualifications are subsidised. Training for existing-worker trainees is not subsidised. Under Smart and Skilled, NSW apprentices and new-entrant trainees or their employers pay a fee for the qualification rather than paying early or by semester. They may still pay in instalments over a number of years, but the fee is an amount for the qualification, fixed at the time the apprentice or trainee commences.

INDIGENOUS APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMME

Indigenous Apprenticeship Programme has been developed for <u>Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander</u>, <u>or both, applicants only (www.humanservices.gov.au/corporate/careers/identifying-as-an-aboriginal-or-torres-strait-islander-person</u> for more details on documentation). Provides a tailored approach to learning, based on academic and cultural requirements. Motivated Indigenous Australians with an interest in contributing to the Australian Public Service should apply.

SCHOOL BASED TRAINEESHIPS/APPRENTICESHIPS

School based traineeships/apprenticeships provide students with the opportunity to attain a nationally recognised Vocational Education and Training (VET) qualification as well as their Higher School Certificate (HSC) and gain valuable work skills and experience through paid employment. School based traineeships/apprenticeships can commence in Year 10. While studying for their HSC, school-based trainees/apprentices work part-time and undertake their formal (off-the-job) training as part of their HSC.

SUPPORT FOR AUSTRALIAN APPRENTICES WITH DISABILITY (INCLUDING DAAWS)

Australian Apprentices with disability and their employers may be eligible to receive additional assistance under the Australian Apprenticeships Incentives Program. A range of assistance is available to support Australian Apprentices with disability, including **Disabled Australian Apprentice Wage Support** which is paid to employers, and assistance for tutorial, interpreter and mentor services for apprentices. Assistance is also available through the Employment Assistance Fund which helps people with disability and mental health conditions by providing assistance to purchase a range of work related modifications and services. Employers can access the scheme via <u>JobAccess</u> or through <u>Disability Employment Services</u> or <u>jobactive</u>. This assistance is intended to help the Australian Apprentice with disability, either directly or indirectly through their employer, to reach their full potential as a skilled worker and to ensure that they are not excluded from participation in the Program.

If you are a school leaver and NOT in receipt of Disability Support Pension, enrolled in a support class/special school, or attracting additional funding under Integration Funding Support, Centrelink can do an assessment to determine which service may be most suitable for you – *jobactive*, Disability Employment Service, or an Australian Disability Enterprise. DISABILITY MANAGEMENT SERVICE (DMS)

For job seekers with disability, injury or health condition who require the assistance of a Disability Employment Service but are not expected to need long-term support in the workplace.

EMPLOYMENT SUPPORT SERVICE (ESS)

For job seekers with permanent disability and with an assessed need for more long-term, regular support in the workplace.

ELIGIBLE SCHOOL LEAVER GUIDELINES

Eligible School Leaver policy applies to both Disability Employment Service (DES) ESS and DMS Programs. There is an expectation that most students will be serviced in ESS, as most will have high ongoing support needs. Students might approach a provider seeking to Directly Register or might become aware of DES because a provider has approached their school. DES providers who are Directly Registering Eligible School Leavers must consider all of the students' circumstances and determine whether DMS or ESS services would better meet the students' needs. Students must be provided with information about various providers and services that are available and given the opportunity to choose a preferred provider. In some cases, if students want to continue with tertiary or other study after they finish school, they may not need a DES.

Documentary Evidence to Support Eligible School Leaver Eligibility

When directly registering a job seeker as an Eligible School Leaver, Disability Employment Service (DES) providers must obtain appropriate documentary evidence to support the job seeker's eligibility. Students must be in their final year of secondary school and receiving the Disability Support Pension or enrolled in a support class/special school or attracting additional funding under Integration Funding Support. Information about the additional educational funding must be obtained from the school principal or his/her representative. Once students leave school it is in their best interest to go to Centrelink who can explain the range of options available, including options around further study or training. Centrelink can also discuss eligibility for income support while studying or looking for work.

AUSTRALIAN DISABILITY ENTERPRISES (ADES)

Australian Disability Enterprises are places of employment that provide support to employees to complete a choice of meaningful work and career paths in a safe work environment. Supported workplaces seek to remove barriers to integration thus enabling people with disability to participate fully in their local community through employment. There are a variety of ADEs operating across NSW providing a variety of tasks and learning opportunities for their employees in a wide range of commercial and industrial operations. ADEs provide a range of employment options to:

- People for whom competitive employment at an award wage in the open labour market is unlikely
- People who, because of their disability, need substantial ongoing support to obtain or retain paid employment

TRANSITION TO WORK SERVICE - NEW

Transition to Work is part of the Australian Government's Youth Employment Strategy.

- **Empowering YOUth Initiative** support young people at risk of welfare dependency into work by inviting not-for-profit community organisations to put forward proposals for innovative ideas that offer a different approach to those currently available.
- **Engaging Early School Leavers** strengthens requirements for young job seekers aged 15-21 yrs who haven't completed Yr 12 to continue their education or look for work to receive Youth Allowance.
- **Work for the Dole** part of *jobactive*, which helps people aged 18 and over gain the skills they need to become work-ready and make a contribution to their local community.
- National Work Experience Programme builds confidence and real life work experience for job seekers and prepare them to meet expectations of employers by undertaking unpaid work experience with businesses, not-for-profit and Government organisations for up to 25 hours per week for a maximum of four weeks per placement.

WORKPLACE HEALTH AND SAFETY

Your employer has an obligation to ensure that you have safe systems of work, safe equipment and proper training. However, you also have an obligation to follow appropriate workplace health and safety procedures. It is important that you follow these procedures, because the last thing you want to do is risk your own health and safety or the safety of your workmates. If you find problems like faulty equipment, slippery floors or a lack of safety gear, tell your employer immediately. You should also tell your employer if you are unhappy with your training and, if nothing happens, see your workplace health and safety representative. If you work through a Group



Training Organisation or Labour Hire agency, report your concerns to them as well. If you are a work experience or structured workplace learning student, you should also speak to your teacher or trainer about your concerns.

YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM - A NEW NSW INITIATIVE FOR H-CC

Open to young people (15-24) in the Central Coast & Hunter regions of NSW, the Department of Industry's *Smart*, *Skilled and Hired Youth Employment Program* is designed to help young job seekers enter the workforce. Young people can become work ready or kickstart a fulfilling career by connecting to training, mentoring, work experience placements, & other support to build their skills & experience. To be eligible you must:

- be out of work, or working part time, or working casual hours (less than 28 hours a week) and needing to get more hours or more stable work
- be aged between 15 and 24 at the time you register
- have either finished Year 10 or have turned 17 years old
- not be registered with Commonwealth employment programs like jobactive, Transition to Work or PaTH, unless you need support with things like mental health, housing, drug problems or transport to help you get a job
- be an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, humanitarian visa holder (including refugee and humanitarian visa categories) or a New Zealand citizen

DISABILITY SERVICE PROVIDERS

NSW POST SCHOOL PROGRAMS - CHANGES WITH THE NDIS

After school many young people with disability will go directly to employment, vocational education and training, or higher education. In addition to these pathways, the NSW Department of Family & Community Services, Ageing Disability & Homecare (ADHC) provided two Post School Programs for eligible young people with disability - *Transition to Work* and *Community Participation*.

WHAT IS THE NDIS?

The NDIS will replace the state system. The NDIS is a new way of working that provides people with disability with choice and control over their lives and the supports they receive. The NDIS will roll out across NSW between 1 July 2016 and 30 June 2018.

WHAT SUPPORTS WILL BE AVAILABLE UNDER THE NDIS?

Under the NDIS, eligible people with disability will have an opportunity to make their own decisions about what supports they need and who provides them. The roll out of the NDIS means that instead of specific programs being run, eligible people with disability - through their plan - will be able to access the reasonable and necessary supports they need in their lives. This means that many of the types of supports and activities that are available from Ageing Disability and Home Care (ADHC) will be available under the NDIS.

If a young person is already receiving disability support from the NSW Government (ADHC) then those current support arrangements will continue until the person can apply to access support under the NDIS. At that point, staff from the National Disability Insurance Agency (NDIA) will meet with the person to discuss their ongoing support needs and how these can be met through the NDIS.

WHO CAN I CONTACT FOR MORE INFORMATION?

Apart from your school, the National Disability Insurance Agency can be contacted on 1800 800 110. More information is also available on the NDIS website \square www.ndis.gov.au. If you're not sure whether you are classed as someone currently receiving ADHC supports, or if you have any questions, you can contact the Life Skills and Respite Information line on 1800 761 030.
